ACC upgrade, school, CofC were WPCCC topics

The December meeting of the Western Pima County Community Council was held last Thursday with topics of discussion including Sheriff's Auxiliary Volunteer programs, Pima County renovation of the Ajo Community Center, local deputy news and Border Patrol agent news, Ajo school programs, Ajo District Chamber of Commerce news, and the WPCCC election for representatives of odd-numbered districts.

Council secretary Lil Jones noted that the minutes of last month's meeting are on file at the library and may be viewed at www.wpccc.info online.

Tom Schnell, director of the SAV program in the Ajo District, talked about recent scams and how to avoid them. He said the vast majority of scams can be prevented if people would hang up on unsolicited phone calls and delete unsolicited e-mails. He added that it is important to shred old paperwork containing personal information such as financial and medical records and credit card statements. Schnell said the community is doing a great job supporting the SAVs through the donation program. Anyone interested in becoming an SAV may call 387-8531.

Deb Miller of Pima County Supervisor Sharon Bronson's office talked briefly about the county's Community Development Block Grant program, noting that representatives from the CDBG department would give a presentation at next month's WPCCC meeting. She added that she would not be able to attend the January meeting.

Robert Vaughn, local manager of Pima County Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation, discussed progress on the upcoming community center renovations. Lighting, window repairs, air conditioning installation, interior painting, duct work, roof repairs, floor replacement, and other projects will be addressed beginning late January or early February, according to Vaughn. He said some of the work will require the community center be

closed for about four months, with an anticipated reopening around June 15. Most PCNRPR programs will continue in the annex on Esperanza Avenue just west of the Curley complex. He said it will be necessary to close the exercise room during the renovation. New locations for some programs such as Senior Nutrition are being sought and will be announced in the *Ajo Copper News* and posted at the community center when locations are established. Vaughn asked that anyone call the office at 387-6641 if they have ideas for new locations. Sports programs will continue in Walker Park.

Sgt. Michael Seeley of the Pima County Sheriff's Department Ajo District gave an update on local deputy news. He said three newly trained deputies began patrol duties in Ajo on November 14. One veteran deputy will return for duty in Ajo on December 1 after a military assignment. Seeley said a detective in Ajo will be rotated back to Tucson soon.

Kelly Graham, US Border Patrol agent assigned to the Ajo Station, reported on local agent news. WPCCC members who had attended the recent grand opening of the new USBP Ajo Station commented on the state-of-the-art facility. Graham said he appreciated the comments and would pass them along. He reported that Ajo Station agents had been involved in three significant marijuana seizures over the past three weeks, keeping an estimated \$2 million in drugs off the streets. Responding to a question about a shooting incident last week involving a Border Patrol agent near Gila Bend, Graham said it involved an agent from Yuma Sector and the case is under investigation. The only information he had so far was that no Ajo Station agents were hurt in the incident.

AUSD superintendent Dr. Robert Dooley said a new science club has been approved by the school board. Teacher Kiran Beharie will organize a science and math fair for grades 4 and 5.

Dooley mentioned the school Christmas Concert set for

Thursday, December 13, and recommended everyone attend because of the treat of watching kids that age sing or play an instrument. The student council has undertaken a toy drive..

Individual results of recent AIMS testing are back and being reviewed. A new standard of testing will begin two years from now, according to Dooley. He said MAP, or Major Academic Project, testing is getting started and is patterned after diagnostic testing used in the medical field. Ajo High School students recently took standard military entrance exams. Dooley noted that tax credit donations may still be made to the school before December 31.

Bety Allen, director of the Ajo CoC, discussed the new website for the chamber of commerce, which may be visited at www.ajo-chamber.com online.

Rick Shumway talked about a new non-profit, Life Enrichment Organization. Jose Castillo asked that people donate to the Knights of Columbus donation drive. Castillo said the KofC spent \$5000 last year on Ajo projects.

WPCCC elects new councilors

An election of new councilors was held at last Thursday's meeting of the Western Pima County Community Council. Representatives for odd-numbered districts were elected.

New councilors are Andrew Sisk, who will represent WPCCC District 5 – Five Acres; Freeman Fry, who will represent District 7 – Lukeville; and Tina West, representing District 9 – At Large.

Paul Vasquez will remain the representative for District 1 – Downtown, Lil Jones for District 3 – Midtown, and Tony Montez for District 11 – At Large.

Representatives of even-numbered districts are Ken Freese for District 2 – Eastside, Carol Yokum for District 4 – Gibson, and Arlene Drete for District 10 – At Large.

District 6 – Why, and District 8 – At Large, remain vacant at this time.

School attendance is up; physics club & textbooks okayed

The Ajo Unified School Board met last week in its scheduled study and regular sessions.

In his report, Superintendent Robert Dooley told the board that attendance figures at the school are more than 91%, a nearly 10% growth since the 2010-11 school year. He attributed the increase to more consistent discipline and a reinvigoration in the student/ classroom dynamic. In a presentation on a new 7th and 8th grade math curriculum, Mercy Arancon described that reinvigoration elegantly: "We must give meaning to every lesson."

On a less-positive note following a study session presentation on AIMS projections based on pre-testing, Dooley told the board that if the data has not improved by the end of February, some changes may be expected. "If we don't see pattern-changing that is good for the kids, we may do some shifting." This subject will be covered more extensively in a future *Ajo Copper News* story. Dooley also reminded the board that the school's Christmas program will take place in the Dicus Auditorium on Thursday, December 13, and that the last day of school before winter break will be Friday, December 21.

Senior Jennifer Guthrie offered a detailed PowerPoint description of the planned senior trip to Disneyland in Anaheim, California, next May. The class has already raised more than \$5000 towards the program, and anticipates raising another \$1000-\$1500 between now and then.

Teacher and audience member Dave Emmers asked for clarification on fundraising efforts being undertaken with regard to augmenting school athletics. Business manager Patti Spencer explained that funds raised through various efforts could be used for general purposes to support all sports, that those given in the tax-credit program could, if not specified, also go to the general athletics program, and that designated tax credits could be assigned to district-approved extracurricular programs, including sports.

In the regular session, the board approved the employment of Arnold Semilla as night-time custodian, and the adoption of a new middle-school math textbook, following Arancon's presentation at the study session. The board also okayed the formation of a physics club, overseen by science and physics teacher Gilbert Gabriel, and its designation as a tax-credit recipient. Junior Anna Rodriguez said that one of the goals for the club would be to build and launch a rocket, planning its design, trajectory, and meet payload requirements. If successful, said Rodriguez, club participants could have the chance to participate in a national competition.

As a formality, the board approved an unfunded 2013 capital plan required by the state's school facilities board. Dooley also informed the board that he is working with representatives of the teachers' association, Spencer, and principal Brian MacKenzie to develop parameters for the 2012-2013 Proposition 301 Plan which provides incentive pay to teachers. The plan, he said, will be presented at the board February 13, 2013, meeting. The board also approved the first revision to the district's 2012-13 budget. The original budget was adopted on July 2, 2012, based on estimated and anticipated amounts for salaries, federal and state grant funding, as well as the 2011-12 ending cash and budget balances.

The board also took action to revise its naming policy, removing the requirement that an individual must be deceased before a facility can be named in his or her honor.

Following the public session Wednesday, the board recessed into executive session for the evaluation of the superintendent and other personnel issues.

Two arrested in recent break-ins

Two juveniles have been arrested for a break-in burglary at First Assembly of God Church that reportedly occurred late Saturday night or early Sunday morning. Lt. BJ Clements, commander of the Pima County Sheriff's Department Ajo District, said one suspect was arrested Sunday and one Monday. Both were booked into the Pima County Juvenile Detention Center in Tucson. Clements said the two were also arrested for two other break-ins in town that occurred about the same time.

Clements noted that recent break-ins prior to the ones Saturday night or early Sunday morning are still under investigation and considered unrelated to the most recent break-ins.

Pastor George Kraft of First Assembly of God Church said break-ins at the church occurred over the Thanksgiving weekend, again two weeks ago, and again last Saturday night or Sunday morning at the First Assembly of God Church. He said about \$100 in total was stolen from the donation box, but the damage to doors and windows at the church is significant.

Alcohol was reportedly stolen from 100 Estrella Restaurant in the most recent break-ins. It was not confirmed at press time where the other break-ins occurred.

USBP shot man near Gila Bend

US Border Patrol agents assigned to the Yuma Sector were involved in a shooting incident about four miles north of the Highway 85 checkpoint between Ajo and Gila Bend on Tuesday, December 4. Agents were responding to a report of alleged bandit activity when they encountered two armed men.

USBP has reported that at least one agent fired his weapon, wounding one of the suspects. The suspect was taken by Life Flight helicopter to a Phoenix medical facility. He is reported in stable condition.

The other suspect, a Mexican national illegally present in the US, was taken into custody on scene. Agents recovered an assault rifle and a handgun at the scene. The FBI is investigating.

Yuma Sector public affairs supervisor Enrique Zarate told the *Ajo Copper News* that no agents were injured in the incident. He noted that bandits often target marijuana loads and the people being smuggled into the US to steal marijuana and valuables or to abuse and kidnap smuggled immigrants.

An article in the *Arizona Daily Star* reports that the incident is the second involving a Border Patrol shooting in a week. On Sunday, December 2, an agent shot and killed a man who got into an altercation with an agent in the southern Baboquivari Mountains on the Tohono O'odham Nation. Agents in this incident were from the Tucson Station.

The latest shooting marks the fourth along the border since October 2, according to the *Arizona Daily Star*.

Annual bird count is this Saturday


Cabeza Prieta National Wildlife Refuge is looking for birders of all skill levels for this year's Ajo Christmas Bird Count. The Christmas Bird Count is a National Audubon Society tradition in its 113th year and has occurred annually in Ajo since 1998. This event is not only a lot of fun but also very important as it serves to further research and conservation efforts for bird species and habitat throughout the country," noted Amanda Selnick, an ecology & wildlife intern at the refuge.

People planning to participate should meet at the refuge on Friday, December 14, at 2 p.m. to go over any questions, discuss who is covering which route, and possibly drive some of the routes.

The actual bird count will take place Saturday, December 15. All volunteers are asked to meet at 7 a.m. at the refuge office. Participants will split up into groups of 2-4 volunteers and each group will cover a pre-determined route within a 15-mile-diameter circle encompassing Ajo and part of the refuge, recording every bird they see or hear.

"We are especially in need of experienced birders, but would love to have everyone participate who is interested and has at least a basic knowledge of Sonoran desert birds!" said Selnick. "We will make sure there is at least one experienced birder per group."



Hang-gliding author will be at public library this Saturday

The group is also interested in obtaining storage space for emergency supplies, as well as determining options for RV and other housing space.

The next scheduled meeting is Tuesday, December 18, at 5:30 p.m. at the Oasis Café, and it is designed as a tutorial to acquaint people with Google Documents and the Sheltering Ajo e-mail program.

On Thursday, January 3, Pam Mosely of Pima County will meet with participants to discuss the emergency solutions grant program. The meeting will be at 6:15 p.m. at the Ajo Community Center, immediately before the Western Pima County Community Council meeting. Anyone interested is invited to attend.



DSCHC is making changes, starting new programs

Desert Senita Community Health Center has some exciting changes happening, according to CEO Fran Driver.

DSCHC has been re-cabling and upgrading the whole medical building in order to make sure they can bring the community the most efficient and up-to-date health care. The health center has been experiencing multiple computer issues over the last year and the new cabling should alleviate the issues.

“One long-overdue change that has come out of this process is a new billing system for dental,” said Driver. “This new billing system will allow Desert Senita Dental to bill in a much timelier and efficient manner. As Desert Senita Dental finishes closing out the old computer system, some dental patients will receive older dental bills that have been slow to process. DSCHC will work with each individual to resolve their outstanding balances. She said the staff appreciates the community’s patience over the past several months while they worked through these computer issues.

The newest feature now available from DSCHC is the Patient Portal. The Patient Portal allows patients of Dr. Richardson and Ben Blackburn, PA, to contact the health center through an encrypted email system any time night or day. Instead of having to call during clinic hours, this system allows a person to request medication refills or send general questions to the provider through a secure electronic option and receive an answer within two business days.

DSCHC is adding a new service for the families in western Pima County. The Healthy Steps program supports families with children from birth to five years old by providing home visitation by a Healthy Steps Specialist who provides education and support

to the parents of young children. The Healthy Steps Specialist will also be present for the child’s well child visits. “The Healthy Steps program is a nationally recognized, evidence based program that helps assure a child is ready for school and set for life,” said Driver.

DSCHC has changed the hours of the referral specialist to Tuesday through Thursday, 8am to 7 p.m. “These new hours should make it easier for working individuals to meet with the referral specialist face-to-face,” she said.

“DSCHC is sad to see Yvonne Crewse, LPC, leave after 4 ½ years,”said Driver, noting the health center is in the process of recruiting a new behavioral health professional. She announced Ben Blackburn, PA, has decided to stay at DSCHC. Driver said she has had many questions from Blackburn’s patients about who to see as a primary care provider and is pleased he has decided to stay with DSCHC for another season. She also noted that Dr. Richardson has taken a brief leave of absence and will be back sometime after the first of the year.

Thursday evening it was obvious to all that these two teams were not in the same league. The tall, talented Phoenixes had hammered Ajo in the season’s opener, 79-11. The Raiders fought hard on their home court and, while they never seriously threatened, they also never backed down. The hard scrapping Raider defense picked up 13 fouls but continued to contest Tonopah to the end, scoring the last 4 points of the game.

So far the Raiders seem to open strong then falter in the 2nd and 3rd before coming alive in the 4th. Tonopah outscored Ajo 16-4 and 18-5 in the 2nd and 3rd. Tonopah often showed a pressing defense that certainly contributed to Ajo’s turnovers. Still the Raiders grow more confident against the press. Ajo again spread scoring among 8

players led by Billy Glass, Josiah Nez, and Mancilla with 5 each.

Ajo continues to struggle with the basics: hitting lay ups, taking care of the ball, making free throws, and preventing offensive rebounds. They missed at least 7 layups against both Babo and Tonopah. Not taking care of ball with precise passing and mental errors like traveling led to 30+ turnovers against Tonopah. Finally, while the Raiders are likely to be shorter than any team they will face this year, they must learn to block out their opponents and rebound aggressively. Allowing an opponent 3-4 shots each possession will not win games.

No doubt this young team has heard these instructions at every practice and they do show improvement. Still one die-hard Raider fanatic Thursday night shouted, “Make ‘em run a mile while dribbling and shoot 100 free throws a day.” Food for thought.

Trees for small spots

There are times when a full-size eucalyptus or mesquite or even citrus tree simply won’t fit in a part of the yard where some shade or privacy is desired. Fortunately, there are smaller-scale choices out there.

Mountain States Nursery in Glendale compiles lists of trees for special locations, such as narrow spaces and containers. The following is a list of species that fall under both of those categories. Blackbrush acacia, which will reach 10 to 15 feet in height at maturity.

Roemer acacia, said to reach 10 feet in height.

Orchid tree, 10 to 18 feet.

Cascalote, 15 feet.

Redbud, 10 to 20 feet.

Curl leaf mountain mahogany, 25 feet.

Texas olive, 10 to 25 feet.

Kidneywood, 10 feet.

Littleleaf ash, 12 feet.

Golden leadball tree, 15 to 25 feet.

Yewleaf willow, over 25 feet.

Texas mountain laurel, 15 to 20 feet.

Rosewood, 10 to 20 feet.

Shiny xylosma, 15 to 25 feet.

Many of the trees on this list are also rather exotic, and therefore harder to find. The typical home improvement center is not the first place to look. This search may call for a visit to a large nursery that specializes in trees. A spin through Google is a good start.
